OZARKA COLLEGE STATISTICS

•For every dollar students invest in Ozarka College, students receive a cumulative \$12.80 in higher future income (discounted) over the course of their working career. *

•Taxpayers see a rate of return of 10.6 % on their investment in Ozarka College. *

•The accumulated credits achieved by former Ozarka College students over the past 30 years translated to \$36.4 million in added regional income in 2009-10 due to the higher earnings of students and increased output of businesses. *

- The Ozarka College service area includes four counties: Fulton, Izard, Sharp and Stone
 - Estimated population: 66,133
 - Total area: 2,420.11 square miles

- Average income per capita in service area: \$18,487
 - State of Arkansas average: \$22,798
 - National average: \$28,930

- Population below poverty level in service area: 19-24% (depending on county)
 - State of Arkansas average: 17.2%
 - National average: 12.7%

- Population with a Bachelor's degree or higher in service area: 16% (depending on county)
 - State of Arkansas average: 21.1%

- Average age of Ozarka College students: 26 years old
