Reception for Miller & Weaver at Ozarka

Ozarka College in Melbourne will host a reception on Friday, December 3, 2004 to recognize the legislative efforts of local State Representative Paul Weaver and State Senator Paul Miller.

According to Ozarka President Doug Rush, "We want to show our appreciation to Representative Weaver and Senator Miller for all the support they have offered to our community, and particularly to Ozarka College. Both have provided strong leadership during their legislative tenure and represented us well." Rush stated that the general public is invited to attend the reception.

Weaver, who represents District 71, served as Izard County Judge for fourteen years and has held various other public offices. He has served on the House of Representatives since 1999. His district includes Independence, Izard and Stone counties in North Central Arkansas. Within the legislature, Weaver has been the co-chair for the Joint Budget Committee and sat on several other committees including the House Education Committee.

Senator Miller will continue into the upcoming legislative session representing District 10 which includes Ozarka's service area (Izard, Fulton, Sharp, and Stone counties). Since joining the senate in 2000, Miller has also served on the joint budget committee and chaired the legislative policy making committee and the senate insurance and commerce committee among others.

The reception is open to any interested parties. Refreshments will be served at 1:00 p.m. in the small dining room of the main building. The public is also invited to see the expansion to the college's library as well as the fitness education center which was recently added in the Miller Education Complex.

During November 10-12, Ozarka College's Adult Education Program was reviewed by three State Program Managers. Ozarka's Program Manager from Little Rock, Priscilla Flowers, along with Emily Barrier and Larry Therrell are in the process of visiting each Adult Education program statewide in an effort to improve programs.

The following week, on November 16, the Adult Education had its biannual Advisory Committee Meeting. Along with the Adult Ed Staff and Ozarka President, Doug Rush, other members of the community who are

on the committee were present. Those attending included: Leland Jackson of WIA, Alan Sherrell of NAESC, Carolyn McCurley of ICC High School, Madeline Sipe, retired DHS Administrator, James Owen Miller of Miller's Supermarket, and Jackie Heck, Probation Officer.

The Committee was given an overview of the Program, including budget, three year plan, and federal report. They were also given some interesting statistics on the program:

- Ozarka pass rate for GED is 78%, which is higher than the national average of 71%;
- * 23.9% of Arkansas residents over 25 do NOT have a high school diploma;
- Ozarka Adult Ed had 18 GED completers qualify for state scholarships; one in the top ten and one in the top 25

The meeting was informative and beneficial and Adult Ed hopes to continue to improve their program.



Early Childhood Courses Begin January 11

Ozarka College will offer a one-semester certificate program in early childhood education during the Spring 2005 term. Amy Pinkston, Director of the Ozarka Kids Academy, will teach the courses necessary for this certificate. The program, designed for those childcare professionals trained in Child Care Orientation (CCOT), is recognized as national credentialing for Child Development Associates (CDA).

Students enrolled in the CDA program will meet on the Melbourne campus from 2-5 p.m. on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons from January 11 through May 26. Courses include Fundamentals of Early Childhood Education, Child Development and Healthy, Safe Learning Environment. In addition, students will complete a practicum which involves working at an approved childcare setting.
