

## 26th Annual FBLA High School Business Competition Day Hosted by Ozarka PBL on January 26

The Delta Alpha Eta Chapter of Phi Beta Lambda (PBL) of Ozarka College hosted its $26^{\text {th }}$ Annual High School Business Competition Day on Wednesday, January 26. Over 170 Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) members from 16 area high schools competed in 16 events. Those schools included: Highland, Evening Shade, Izard County Consolidated, Melbourne, Mt. Pleasant, Norfork, Mountain View, Rural Special, Mammoth Spring, Hillcrest, Salem, Cotter, Viola, Timbo, Calico Rock, and Williford.

Phi Beta Lambda members and advisors were responsible for the organization, communication, registration, administration and grading of tests, and the presentation of awards. On behalf of Ozarka's Phi Beta Lambda chapter, Business Instructor and PBL Advisor, Brad Hollaway, extended a heartfelt thanks to everyone who participated and assisted with the competition. "We appreciate all of the high schools and FBLA advisors as well as the faculty, staff, and administration of Ozarka College for helping make this a successful High School Business Competition Day! We especially appreciate each and every participant for their hard work and determination both in preparation for and during the competitions."

The Sweepstakes Awards are given to the schools with the most accumulated points. Points are earned on the following basis: 3 points for $1^{\text {st }}$ place in each event; 2 points for $2^{\text {nd }}$ place in each event; and 1 point for $3^{\text {rd }}$ place in each event. The school with the most points at the end of Competition Day is awarded a one-year, tuition-paid scholarship for a student from their school to attend Ozarka College. The second and third place schools receive a one-semester, tuition-paid scholarship for a student from their schools to attend Ozarka College. This year Mountain View won $1^{\text {st }}$ place, Melbourne won $2^{\text {nd }}$ place, and Calico Rock won $3^{\text {rd }}$ place.
