staff, led by Mimi Newsome, served a top quality meal that included prime rib and delectable desserts.



STAR Program Money Available

The Arkansas Department of Higher Education (ADHE) has announced a new scholarship program to students pursuing an education in Associate of Arts in Teaching up to a Master of Arts in Teaching. The program is entitled STAR, which in an acronym for *State Teacher Assistance Resource*.

Students who qualify can receive up to \$6,000 per year if they agree to teach for two years in a public school located in an area designated as having a critical shortage, and/or in a specific subject matter area, such as math and science.

Several elementary schools in Ozarka's service area have qualified as critical schools, including; Melbourne, ICC,

Mountain View, Salem, Williford, Central Elementary in Batesville, and Mammoth Spring. To see a complete list of schools, and/or download the entire application packet, log on to www.arkansashighered.com.

Some of the requirements to apply include, a cumulative GPA of 2.75, entering sophomore, junior or senior level in an accredited college or university in Arkansas, and being enrolled as a fulltime student.
