However, the Ozarka Team has made it rain during the 2021-2022 academic year, topping the charts of three outstanding rankings by nationally-recognized research firms. Of colleges eligible, Ozarka received the following rankings:



- Best Online Associate Degree in Arkansas (UniversityHQ), Ranked 1 of 25.
- Best Community Colleges in America (Smart Asset), Ranked 13 of 801.
- Best Associate Degree College in Arkansas (UniversityHQ), Ranked 1 of 25.

Both UniversityHQ and Smart Asset are online resources focused on helping consumers make good decisions for themselves and their families, including choices for higher education.

Ozarka is honored to be recognized and these distinctions are truly a reflection of Ozarka's quality education, faculty and staff commitment, and exceptional community support.


SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE


This would not be possible without the significant support and generosity of our community partners, Ozarka employees, and the Foundation Board.
