2011 Commencement Keynote and Information



The 2011 Ozarka College Commencement will take place on May 12 at 7:00 p.m. in the John E. Miller Auditorium.

The Commencement keynote speaker this year is Senator Shane Broadway of Bryant. Broadway is interim director for the Arkansas Department of Higher Education (ADHE). He is a member of Governor Mike Beebe's full cabinet as well as the Governor's Workforce Cabinet, an appointed group of government leaders state charged with creating 21st Century jobs and skilled workers.

An Arkansas State University alum- For those students graduating, nus, Broadway served three terms as a representative for Pulaski and Saline Counties, and two terms in the senate. He was elected speaker of the house by his colleagues in 2001.

Education is important to Senator Broadway and he was at the forefront of the legislature's push to continue improving Arkansas's educational system, serving on the education committee during his tenure in the General Assembly. Creating economic development opportunities to bring jobs to the state has been another focus of Broadway's efforts, both as a legislator and as a private consultant.

Economic Impact Study Results Released

Economic Modeling Specialists, Inc. (EMSI) was contracted earlier this year to conduct an economic impact study for Ozarka College. The study measures the economic benefits received by students and the communities served by Ozarka College.

Ozarka College President, Dr. Richard Dawe, expressed his thoughts about the study. "It is exciting to see the positive results from this economic impact study and realize the effects Ozarka has on our region as a whole.

The contributions due to Ozarka's presence in the region are both significant and remarkable when one considers the many benefits from student, taxpayer and social perspectives, as articulated in the EMSI study." He adds, "The results demonstrate that Ozarka is a sound investment from each of these perspectives."

Some of the highlights from the study include the following:

• Ozarka students receive an impressive return on their investment in their education at Ozarka, at \$12.80 of future higher income for every dollar they invest.

• As a taxpayer in Ozarka's service area, the return is substantial at 10.6 percent for every dollar invested in tax support.

• The combined local economies receive \$6.4 million in net added income each year due to payroll and operations.

• The added annual income due to the activities of Ozarka College and its former students is \$42.8 million.

• Arkansas benefits from improved health and reduced welfare, unemployment and crime, saving the public \$637,300 per year.
