Ozarka Ash Flat to Host Open House

Officials from Ozarka College have announced plans for a September 8th ribbon cutting and grand opening to officially celebrate completion of a new facility in Ash Flat. The public is invited to attend the open house event. The Ozarka College Culinary Arts will provide hors d'oeuvres from Noon until 2 PM and the new student center/nursing building will be open for tours until 6 PM.

Ozarka College President, Dr. Dusty R. Johnston expressed his excitement about opening the state-of-the-art facility designed by Rico Harris of Harris Architecture in Hot Springs and built by Tate General Contractors of Jonesboro. "This new 9,200 square foot facility houses a nursing lab and classroom, a study center; two general classrooms, office space, a conference room, a spacious student center, and the cyber café, which was funded by a generous donation from CenturyTel to the Ozarka College Foundation."

The 30 acre tract of land located on College Drive was donated to the college by First National Banking Company and Mr. Bob Watson in March of 2002. The original 16,000 foot building was open in the Spring of 2005.

With increased number of students and the expanding LPN program to Ash Flat, the support of the local sales tax base in the City of Ash Flat, and the passing of statewide bond reissue last year, the Ozarka College Board of Trustees and administration began planning the new construction earlier this year. College officials will be on hand to participate in the dedication of the new building and to provide tours on September 8th.
